November Attendance

The whole school attendance for November was 94.91%, a significant drop to October and taking us well below our floor target of 96%. Last November the attendance was 95.79% and the winter virus was the reason for last years drop. The respiratory and noro virus have been the cause of the low attendance this month. These are winter viruses that are at large in the community. Please follow the advice we have sought from HPA, which you can access here http://www.consett-jun.durham.sch.uk/community-noro-and-respiratory-virus-important-information/. However, it was very disheartening to find that the attendance today, Friday 29th November was considerably low in comparison with all other days this week and many families failed to contact the school with valid reasons for absence. The Academy was closed today, and nine of our absent pupils have siblings at the Academy. Their closure is not a reason to keep your child off school, those absences have been recorded as unauthorised. Please continue to keep us informed if your child is absent due to illness, as this ensures any registration marks applied are correct.

Year 6 have achieved the best attendance overall (95.40%) for November and each child were given a giant muffin, (Friday 29th) as their reward. Class 8 also achieved the reward for the best class attendance for November at a brilliant 97.60% (was on target to be almost 99% but today's unauthorised absences have significantly impacted on this), and the children came to school in non-uniform for free today (Friday 29th November). Year 3 have the lowest attendance at 92.32% for November, however, class 1 were worst affected by the viruses.

There are children in ALL year groups who are absent without providing a valid reason, and we have addressed this with the families.

There are children arriving late in ALL year groups, and this is monitored, families will have this stated on their attendance letters when they go out in a few weeks, and we do hope this will improve and you use us to support you, which is our main goal. Remember, if/when children move up to the Academy, lessons start at 8.30 a.m!

The autumn term attendance letters will go out to all families. Schools are responsible for monitoring their own attendance and to support and set targets where necessary. Part of this monitoring means we will send letters home twice a year so that you know where your child's attendance stands, and if further action is required, we have opportunity to support you though the process. Our letters are colour coded using a traffic light system, green if above 96%, orange if between 90 - 96% and red if below 90%. Autumn term letters are based on attendance since September, so if your letter at this point in the year identifies a low % it means that there are still two terms for this to improve. If your letter advises you contact the school to arrange a meeting, we urge you to do this.
