Attendance

The whole school attendance for January was 94.52% so we have a little bit to go to get above the government's target of 96%, January 2023 was 94.63% so a slight drop to last year. We have identified there are issues with attendance across Year 3, please ensure children are in school when well enough. There are concerns about children missing valuable learning time across this year group, and for some families this will be discussed in requested attendance meetings and/or parent/carer evening appointments. Can we please ask families of this year group to aim to have their children in school and on time, whilst we recognise children are absent due to illness, there are far too many persistent absentees across this year. We do look back at previous year's attendance and compare patterns of absence, this includes their previous school. Year 5 remain our strongest year for attendance, and this has been a pattern since they

started in year 3. Children who are not in school can fall behind very easily and they miss gaps of learning which they struggle to catch up.

January attendance results...

The **year group** in first place, by quite a clear margin was Year 5 🕒 . Well done to all of Year 5 for such a great effort, 95.1% and the reward is 'sweet treats; this Friday (2nd February) 🖨 🕒 🧠

The **registration group** race was close, 3rd was Class 6 at 95.2%, 2nd was Class 3 at 95.3% the WINNERS were Class 8 at 95.9%. Therefore Class 8 (Miss Waters) can have a free non-uniform day this Friday (2nd February).

Year 3 are causing some concern and many attendance meeting requests have been in this Year group, please use the support we are able to offer to improve your child's attendance, working with us can help identify any barriers to the children coming to school.
