#### **Attendance**

The attendance overall for April was 96.67%. For the entire year so far, it is 95.4% so we have a bit to go to get above the 96%.

Over the last few days, we have been writing out to families for several reasons regarding attendance. You can check your child's attendance on the app. The government's target is for children's attendance to be above 96% - sadly, due to individual circumstances, some children can fall below this. However, our role is to monitor and improve attendance and because of this, we do need to alert families where attendance is low.

#### We will write to you for one of these reasons:

- Invite to a meeting
- Alert you that your child's attendance is lower than the expectation. These letters will be written to acknowledge individual circumstances i.e. on-going health concern, a holiday has caused attendance to drop
- If you had a meeting with us last term and attendance has improved. It is equally important to acknowledge where improvements have been made, these are positives. Unless, since the meeting, there has been no improvements

If you **do not** get a letter, it is because we understand why attendance is low and on comparing with previous year's attendance, we can see there is no pattern.

We are requested to act where attendance falls below 96% - while we do monitor this, it is completely unrealistic for us to invite families of all children below 96% to a meeting. We know our families well enough to intervene at any time we feel there are concerns. I understand that receiving these letters can frustrate families, we are simply doing our job.

If you are invited to a meeting it is vitally important that you arrange this meeting, our data links to the LEA so we are your first port of call to get support and we would much prefer it comes from us and not escalated to County level.

Meetings will be held with either myself, Mr Dixon, or us both.

#### April attendance results...

Another close race this month, Year 6 have topped the charts AGAIN with 97.48% attendance, even higher than last month, therefore their treat day is this Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> May, children in Year 6 will have a selection of goodies to enjoy that day.

The registration group reward was extremely close, and this month Class 5 have been knocked off the top spot, CLASS 7 have put an end to their winning streak. They achieved and amazing 98.91% attendance in April and were closely followed by Class 5 who achieved 97.48%...well done Class 7, enjoy a free non-uniform day on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> May.

Delivery can be made to home or school but if you are ordering for delivery to school, please <u>do not</u> choose this option if placing orders in July.

There is NO expectation that you purchase uniform from our providers, many high streets stores stock our colours of uniform. All we do expect is that children do wear our colours.

### Year 6 SATS

Year 6 have worked extremely hard this week on their last set of practise assessments before the real thing! The assessments that we used were last year's papers and they were tough, but the children are close now and need to continue to work hard over the next two weeks at home and at school. Please encourage the children to complete homework and read each night - little and often is the most beneficial.

To help ensure the children are on top form for SATS week, we are offering FREE breakfast club for Year 6 Monday 13th - Friday 17th May. Children can come to school any time after 7.45am and eat breakfast with their friends and teachers. This will be beneficial for the children as it will help them to relax and ensure they are in the best frame of mind to begin each of the assessments.

Please remind the children that the outcome of these tests is not relevant to the amazing children that they are, will continue to be and will be. They are government tests and do not consider the amazing qualities every one of them have and how successful we know they are going to be.

### Year 4 running trial dates

Children in Year 4 who want to try out for the team need to come to school wearing their school PE kits on their allocated day, they need to see me at 12 noon (before they eat!), tell them that when the bell goes, they come to main reception.

We will take them through a gruelling running trial and will choose the <u>eight</u> best runners from each class to join the team. They will be told that day if they have made it and any child not successful can join a waiting list, sometimes when children know how hard and committed training can be they drop out, plus, training will be a Monday lunchtime so they will miss 20 minutes play. We not only choose children based on speed, but we also choose on their ability to listen and follow instruction and team encouragement.

Unfortunately, although I can choose the team now, due to limited staff runners, actual training cannot start until September but knowing they are in the team will give them time to practise.

Please discuss this with your child as it may not be for everyone, and please also stress the importance of road safety when they start in September. We do stress this and our children are excellent but sometime newer members get a little excited  $\Theta$ 

### CC team 7 mile run to Lanchester

On Wednesday 15th May we are planning a 7-mile run (approx.) with selected members of our CC team. We will be running from school at approx. 2.00 p.m. to the Play Park in Lanchester. We will access this route by running to the petrol station roundabout at Morrisons joining the cycle path by to run the line to Lanchester.

We will all run as a team and run backs to those at the back are essential, we estimate it will take about an hour and a half. Once at the Play Park we will have sweets and drinks from the local shop (paid through school fund). We will have a coach booked to bring us back to school and estimate this will be a 4.30 p.m. return.

If we think your child will be able to manage this run, we shared a form to complete on 24/04/2024. If you are unsure and want to talk about it give Mrs Raine a ring. If you have not received this form, it is either because we feel that it is too far for your child OR they have only recently started to train with us. if the weather is not on our side, we may need to rearrange.

### Whole school move up day

On Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> June Year 6 will go the Academy (if that is their chosen school), Year 2 will spend the day with us, and all other classes will spend the day in their new class. We are finalising classes for next year and an app post will be added to the newsfeed with details of your child's next teacher in the coming weeks.

### **Summer Term Attendance Reward**

On Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> July, we will celebrate our summer term attendance. <u>All children</u> were part of the attendance assembly to promote the importance of being in school regularly and on time. <u>All children</u> were provided with raffle tickets as follows:

Below 96% = 1 ticket; +96% = 2 tickets; +97% = 3 tickets and so on till 100% (6 tickets). There will be a lower and upper school draw in the assembly and the winner will see me the following day to purchase a prize up to the value of £20 on Amazon. This will give the child the time at home to choose something. Last term Owen and Henry won this prize and enjoyed choosing their reward.

Throughout the day ALL children were rewarded with treats and refreshments and had an hour of crafts/movie/music during class time.

Any child can be unwell at any time during the year, 96% is a reasonable target that takes into consideration that someone can been unwell but still achieve 96%. Sadly, it is not the child's fault if they are absent, but they can be involved in the process of the importance of coming to school regularly and on time, where they are fit to do so. This day not only promotes good attendance overall, but it also promotes much improved attendance of children where we have identified there is concern.

All schools choose their own procedures on rewarding and promoting attendance - most do not reward anything other than 100%.

Can I also take this time to thank our families for supporting our attendance goals and keeping us informed if children are absent. We will soon catch up with families who we met with in the spring term and arrange meetings with families were attendance either continues to be a concern, or ones that have caused concern during the spring term.

### <u>Celebrations – 100% attendance and our annual Special Recognition Awards 2023/2024</u>

On Thursday 18th July we will be holding our annual Special Assembly in school. This assembly is to praise all children who have achieved 100% attendance for the **whole** school year and for children who have been nominated for a recognition award. The recognition award acknowledges that a child has shone  $\bigcirc$  over the year, this could be kindness, academic ability, and progress, or just generally being so wonderful that it has been noticed.

If your child is going to receive a special award you will be informed, we will not tell the children about this, so it is a surprise. You can check if your child has 100% attendance on the app, but we will also send these families a message, we have 33 children so far, last year only 13 achieved this.

If these awards apply to your child we will reserve two seats per child for the assembly, which will start at 9.10 a.m. (after registration) - there will be an opportunity for photos after the event.

The assemblies will be split in two as follows:

If your child is in Year 3 or 4 their assembly will be 9.00 - 9.30 p.m. and two adults can attend.

If your child is in Year 5 or 6 their assembly will be 9.45 - 10.15 a.m. and two adults can attend.

It does not end there, on the evening we will also take all these children for tea at Sambucas, a pre-order menu will be sent home beforehand so we can have this in place for the evening. Children are to be brought to the restaurant for 5.45 p.m. and collected again at 7.30 p.m.
