### **September Attendance Overview and Rewards**

At the end of the first month the attendance statistics are in. The Year group with the most amazing attendance and a phenomenal start to the school year is YEAR 3!! They have smashed the Governments floor target even though they have the highest level on unauthorised absences and lates, we are looking forward to what they achieve in October and hope the late marks can be lower. As a treat for Year 3 on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> October there will be a special delivery of cakes, cookies and fruit.

The whole school attendance for September was 95.64%, which is just slightly below the governments floor target of 96%. However, in September 2022 it was 95.62% so still an increase on last year.

If your child is absent from school for any reason you <u>MUST</u> inform the school. There have been times when children are absent, and <u>no</u> reason has been provided. By law, all children of compulsory school age must receive a suitable full-time education. For most families, this means registering their child at school. Therefore, all children who are registered at school must attend, if your child is not in school and you have not submitted a reason within a timely manner – you are breaking the law. The reasons children are absent and any times they are late are all recorded by us, and these are the things we will disclose should we need to refer a family to the attendance team at DCC. If children are unwell there are several ways you can inform the school office, as it is known that sometimes getting through on busy mornings can be difficult. You can ring 01207 504431, alternatively the school app has a means to message and record absences. You can also monitor your child's attendance though the app therefore identifies good or poor attendance levels at any time of the year. Finally, there is also an option to email <u>consettjunior@durhamlearning.net</u>

If your child is poorly and their illness means they need to be absent for 48 hours, you must contact school on the first day of their absence and we will advise you if you need to ring again on the second day of absence. If your child's absences become frequent or pattern based, i.e., off regularly on Mondays or Fridays, then action will be taken to prove your child is off unwell. This may mean letters are requested from their GP, a home visit from the school or a visit from a DCC attendance team officer. You can be prosecuted if your child has unauthorised absences from school.

Please ensure you try to make medical appointments outside of school time, any made during the school day must be supported with a letter detailing the appointment. Although medical appointments are authorised, they do not qualify as an attendance mark.

As you are aware it is against the law to take holidays during term time, we do refer families to the LA (local authorities) for fixed penalty fines. Clear guidelines regarding the triggers for penalty notices can be found on our website or issued at your request. These procedures are strongly in place in all schools, and although our attendance is good overall, we must comply with legislation.

If your child's school meals arrears start to exceed £40 - £50 we will remove the school meal option until the arrears are paid.

We are getting prepared for the Halloween Celebrations and have recently shared a 'spooky' themed menu on our app for the week we return after half term. As this is a themed week it is an opportunity for children on packed lunches to try school meals for one week only. ### Swimming Sessions - Important Update for Year's 5 (Class 5 & 6)

Mr. Meadows' class will swim this half term only.

Mr. Moore's class will swim w/c 6<sup>th</sup> November 2023 on either Tuesday or a Thursday, families will be informed of their child's swimming day over the coming weeks.

Please ensure you make a note of your child's swimming day as they MUST come to school with their swimming costumes (no bikini) and a towel. Children not swimming due to illness will remain at school while their class swims.

### **School Photographs Ordering**

The deadline date for orders to be returned to school is Thursday 26th October, any orders received in school after this date will be sent back home. Mark is really flexible and has said that if you miss the order deadline you can take them to his shop in Middle Street. Mark has also said that if you are not happy with the image you can make an appointment in his shop and he will take them again.

All payments go directly to Mark via school, we do not gain any commission from these photos as this is part of our agreement with him, he keeps costs low for families due to this. When making payments you need to return the proof to me, ensure the form is filled in completely and enclose the exact amount. I do not open the envelopes so unless you enclose a cheque or add your card details you must enclose the exact amount.

### Snack for morning break

Children are allowed to bring in a healthy snack for their morning break, it is extremely popular, however, there have been some issues with the types of snack children are bringing in. Examples of the snacks that are allowed are fruit, vegetable sticks, cereal bars, a tub with cereal I.e., shreddies, wheetos; frubes. We do not allow crisps, chocolate, cakes, or sweets of any kind.

### **Covid cases**

Just an update for families who are unsure of what to do if their child (or the adults have covid). As we learn to live with covid it can be confusing of what you can or cannot do. If you choose to test your child for covid and it is positive the advice for children is to stay at home for three days (from the positive test or when they were first unwell). If an adult or other family members in the home test positive and your child is well, they can still come to school. There is no obligation to test, it is deemed a respiratory illness and if the child is too unwell for school, they stay at home.

## Children in Need 2023

The school council will be getting together over the next few weeks to discuss their fundraising plans for Children in Need – once they have reached a decision we will share this with families.

#### Harvest

As part of our Harvest celebrations this year, we will be collecting for Consett food bank. Food items need to be non-perishable and brand new and we will also be collecting toiletries and cleaning products. The food bank helps many people in Consett who are in genuine crisis and they rely on the kindness of donations to support them. Any donations are gratefully received and will be displayed in school reception. We will be collecting until Friday 20th October.

### Salvation Army Toy Appeal

Every year we support the Salvation Army Toy Appeal and ask for donations of new and unused toys that are given to local families in financial difficulty at Christmas. We are yet to find out what is happening for collections this year but from experience this is a much-needed collection. We will keep you informed once we know more but feel free to send in donations now. If you need help this Christmas we can refer you so you receive additional gifts for your child, please contact us if you would like this help.

### Flu Immunisation programme

The flu nasal immunisation team will be in school on Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> October, only children with consent will receive this immunisation.

## Traffic, parking around school and the Staff car park

Now that our new families are well established with the drop off and collection of children, we want to ensure you are aware of the protocol around school. During the busy times we operate a one-way system around the school, often cars coming down Beech Dale Road are met with cars coming the opposite way, this can cause carnage! Please travel down Oakdale Road (from Ashdale) and loop round to go back up Beech Dale Road. Please be mindful of our residents and do not block or obstruct their driveways.

There are also families using our staff car park, we do lock these gates so parking there puts you at risk of being locked in. This facility is not a drop off/collection zone, it is for staff parking and deliveries only.

### Dogs on the premises

Can we remind families that there are **strictly no dogs allowed on the yard.** There are signs up on the parent shelter and on the side of the school building. Please can you ensure other people collecting your child are aware of this. We have noticed several families bringing their dog onto the yard to collect their children.

### Academy siblings collecting from school

If your child is collected by a sibling that does not go to this school (Academy) can you please ensure they behave in an acceptable manner and do not bring crowds of other Academy children with them.

### Secondary Admissions Application Process for 2024

The application process for the Secondary Admissions 2024 Intake began on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> September 2023.

Parents can make their application for Secondary School online by visiting <a href="www.durham.gov.uk/schooladmissions">www.durham.gov.uk/schooladmissions</a> and the School Admissions online application facility was available to parents from Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> September 2023.

### The Closing Date for Secondary School Applications is the 31st October 2023.

If parents do not wish to apply online they can complete a paper application form, and these are available on request from the School Admissions Team from **05**<sup>th</sup> **September 2023**.

Please note that if you have any year 6 pupils who live in another local authority but attend your school, the parents should contact their Home Local Authority (i.e. the authority to which they pay their council tax) to request an application form, even if the parent would like to apply for a Secondary School in County Durham.

As there is a club on in the hall until 4.30 p.m. access arrangements for the drop-in are as follows:

From 3.25 p.m. until 4.35 p.m. entrance through the yard and round to their class using their fire doors (this is where they come from when you collect them each night.

From 4.35 p.m. access is through the main reception door and head to the classrooms.

If this is not something children want to participate in then we can ensure they access a quieter area to enjoy alternative activities.

We are requesting a £2 per child contribution to the cost of the disco and a payment item has been set up on ParentPay. Children can come to school dressed in their 'spooky outfits', masks must not be worn on the yard or in class so please tell your child they are for the purpose of the party hour only.

There will be no change to the start and finish times of the school day.

If your child is in Class 5 and swimming on this day can you please ensure they do not wear face paint/hair colour and their costume is suitable for them to change independently at the baths.
