Attendance

We would like to take this opportunity to share some important information regarding school attendance for this academic year. As of today, our school attendance stands at 95.8%, which is slightly below the national average of 96.3%. Out of 227 pupils this level of attendance reflects our commitment to ensuring that every child is supported in their learning journey.

Please remember that school attendance is crucial for your child's academic success, social development, and future opportunities. Regular attendance helps students grasp key subjects, build essential social skills, and demonstrates reliability to future employers.

Families can easily check their child's individual attendance by logging into the school app. We encourage you to stay informed about your child's attendance record.

As we have completed seven weeks of this academic term, we will be closely reviewing attendance data. For families with noticeably low attendance or patterns of absences, we may arrange a meeting to discuss ways we can support you and your child. If your child had a low attendance rate last year and was on an attendance contract, please remember that this must still be followed.

We understand that occasional absences may occur due to holidays or legitimate health conditions, provided that we have received the necessary documentation. In such cases, a meeting will not be required. However, we will also address any ad-hoc days missed in our attendance review process.

October Attendance Results

We're thrilled to announce the results of our October attendance challenge! Drumroll, please! This month, Class 1 has emerged victorious, achieving an outstanding attendance rate of 98.15%, earning a well-deserved free non-inform day on Friday 7th November! A fantastic effort that has seen them knock Class 2 off their previous top spot!

Hot on their heels, Class 3 was just a fraction behind with an impressive 98.11%, showcasing the competitive spirit in our school. It was so close, in fact, that I had to wait for the afternoon marks before finalising this announcement!

In our year group category, **Year 3** takes the crown again for the second consecutive month, with an incredible **97.91%**. They will be treated to some delightful sweet treats on the same day. Congratulations to all our classes for your dedication and hard work! Keep it up!

As this trip takes place in a warmer month, the cost will be higher; although I do not yet have final costs, I would budget for approximately £350.

Reminder of end of school day finish times

Since returning in September, we have observed an increase in the number of children being collected early from school by their siblings who attend Consett Academy, as well as those with children in Beechdale Nursery. As you know, our school day ends at 3.25 p.m. or 3.30 p.m., and it is crucial for our children to be present in class until this time. Leaving even 20 minutes early is similar to arriving late each morning, as it disrupts their learning and the educational environment for others.

While we understand that early collections may be necessary for appointments, this message is intended to address those regular and routine early pickups that can be avoided. Afternoon lessons often involve foundation subjects such as art and PE, and being called away can upset children who are engaged in their work or team games.

We kindly ask for your cooperation in ensuring that children remain in school until the end of the day.

Christmas Show information

At Consett Junior School, we pride ourselves on putting on the ultimate Christmas shows to entertain our families and this year will be no different! We are aware that this means two shows in one day for families with children in lower and upper school, we are sorry about that, but it is unavoidable and is to support families with children across the school who struggle with time off from work.

Our Christmas Shows are as follows, please take a few minutes to read this information to ensure the day runs smoothly, Tickets sales are open on ParentPay now, £3 per ticket.

On **Tuesday 16th December** your children will all perform on stage in the theatre at Consett Academy

Year 5/6 -10.00 - 11.00 a.m. Year 3/4 - 2.00 - 3.00 p.m.

Both shows are at **Consett Academy** and will follow these housekeeping rules - you **WILL NOT** access the theatre through their main student entrance.

- To gain entrance to the theatre please go through the Leisure Centre main door, walk past the reception desk on your right and along and through the doors stating, 'Squash Courts'. Please try to remain quiet as there will be members of the public participating in sports.
- There are two tickets allocated per child. So, if you have a child in Year 3 you can purchase two tickets. If you have a child in Year 3 and Year 4 you can purchase up to four tickets. This allows every child to have at least two adults there to watch their show. I will monitor ticket sales nearer the time of the show and the likelihood is we can open up 'additional' ticket sales on a first come basis.
- Before you enter the theatre, Mrs Raine will need to sign you in you will already have provided the details of who is attending so this will be a fairly quick process.
- The doors will open at 9.30 a.m. for the morning show and 1.30 p.m. for the afternoon show but the shows will not start until 10.00 a.m. and 2.00 p.m. so, if you get there within the 30 minutes before the show starts, please note you will have a longer wait.
- Both shows will last approximately an hour.
- Morning shows will mean the children return to school for lunch and their afternoon lessons, afternoon show will mean the children have their lunch before they leave and will bring their belongings with them to leave for home from the theatre.
- If you have siblings in Consett Infant School we have asked them to hold your child back if they are in the afternoon show.
- At the end of the afternoon show children will have their belongings with them and will be excused from the stage by class. Clubs and Infant School childcare are still on and these children have the option to leave with you, or return to school with staff.
- All adults, regardless of the show they are watching, will then exit the theatre the way you came in, through the Leisure Centre.
- Important as well as purchasing your tickets through ParentPay you must complete this https://forms.office.com/e/WbqCyypP9Q
- The Academy need to know who is in their building for Safeguarding and Health & Safety. If you purchase two tickets, you only complete one form with their names on. If you then purchase additional tickets, you will need to complete this form again adding their names. If you do not do this, it will cause problems on show day, and we will refuse entry. If the person you name changes before the show you must inform us. DO NOT COMPLETE THIS FORM IF YOU HAVE NOT PURCHASED TICKETS.
- You will not receive physical tickets; your ParentPay payment is your receipt and the register we hold will record the number of seats allocated and purchased.
- This will not impact on the usual school meal arrangements.
- If there are children in the show with no adult present, they will return to school with class teachers for collection.
- You must not video or take photos of your children during the performances we have a duty to safeguard children in our care.
- Enjoy the show it can be very daunting for our smaller children to be so amazing on the stage, so make them feel as magical as the stars they are!

Families are kindly requested to ensure their children are dressed in the correct school uniform and that all items are clearly named. There has been an unprecedented increase in lost property after just four weeks, with many items unlabelled. Furthermore, named items are frequently not being returned after they go home with children. Additionally, it has been noticed that some children are wearing football strips for PE, which is against school policy. Please make sure that your child's PE kit complies with the established guidelines found on the school website: School Uniform Policy.

Reach More Parents – Consett Junior School App

As you are aware, the school utilises *Reach More Parents* (Consett Junior School app in app store) to communicate with families. This app provides up-to-date information, event details, and a facility to contact the office, as well as report absences. Any adult with parental responsibility can access the app; however, it is common for only one parent to enrol, which is acceptable provided at least one parent follows the communications. During busy periods, such as this, failing to engage with the app may result in missing essential information. Notifications can be disabled, but doing so may lead to missed school events.

IMPORTANT: If you have not activated your Reach More Parents account when the link is sent to you, you may miss out on important information.

Below is information about applying for your child's secondary school place. One bit of advice, please ensure you click "submit" and check that you have received a generic email from the team.

"The application process for the Secondary Admissions 2026 Intake begins on 01 September 2025. Parents can make their application for Secondary School online by visiting www.durham.gov.uk/schooladmissions

The Closing Date for Secondary School Applications is the 31 October 2025. If parents do not wish to apply online, they can complete a paper application form, and these are available on request from the School Admissions Team from 01 September 2025. These application forms can be requested by e-mail to schooladmissions@durham.gov.uk or by telephone from the School Admissions and Transport Team on 03000 265896.

Please note that if you have any year 6 pupils who live in another local authority but attend your school, the parents should contact their Home Local Authority (i.e., the authority to which they pay their council tax) to request an application form, even if the parent would like to apply for a Secondary School in County Durham.
