# **Emergency Contacts**

As you are aware, we use a school app to communicate with families. This app is utilised for general day-to-day communication and reminders. In the event of an emergency concerning an individual child, the text message service will not be used initially; telephone contact will be made in priority order to all numbers on the child's file. If there is a whole school emergency requiring evacuation, the app, email, and text message system will be used simultaneously.

We understand that due to the nature of some families' jobs, they may not always have their phone to hand. If this applies to you, please inform the school if you have not already done so. These parents/carers' details will be added to a contingency list, which will be included in the evacuation emergency pack.

Our school app and website remain the primary forms of communication to families for whole school and year group information. Please make a habit of checking these systems regularly. If you have changed your phone number or moved address, ensure this information is provided to Mrs Raine or updated on your side of the app.

# **Spring Attendance Reward**

From Monday, 5th January, all children will be back in the attendance draw for the Spring term. Therefore, if their attendance was lower than hoped last term, they have a fresh start at gaining more raffle tickets for the Spring Term reward. All children are in with a chance of being awarded 6 raffle tickets. Children who achieved 6 last term will need to maintain their excellent attendance level this term.

Any child can be unwell at any time during the year; 96% is a reasonable target that takes into account that someone can be unwell but still achieve 96%. While it is unfortunate if a child is absent, they can still be involved in understanding the importance of attending school regularly and on time when they are fit to do so. This initiative not only promotes good attendance overall but also encourages improved attendance among children where we have identified concerns.

All schools choose their own procedures for rewarding and promoting attendance; most do not reward anything other than 100%.

**Reminder:** Registers close at 9.15 a.m., so children arriving at school after this time will receive an unauthorised mark. These marks are referenced should a referral for a fine be necessary. Unauthorised marks count when referrals are made for processing fines or further action.

In January, I will be contacting some families regarding concerns over attendance. I will be writing to these families to arrange meetings.

#### **School Dinners**

We continue to have over half of the school children on school meals each day, with Friday still being an extremely popular choice. Please ensure you inform Mrs Raine when your child changes meal arrangements, as your ParentPay account will be charged accordingly. There are several families in arrears on ParentPay for school meals and/or breakfast club; please ensure your accounts have enough credit for the services you use. Moving forward, we will be reviewing these arrears, and regular prompts for payments at the Finance Committee will be implemented, as the administration time to send reminders to the same families each week is becoming problematic.

# Year 6 Trip to Robinwood

A reminder that the full balance for the Year 6 trip to Robinwood must be paid by Friday, 24th April. Failure to pay will mean your child will lose their place.

## Glow Back Monday!

On the first day back after our Christmas break (Monday, 5th January), we have booked an exciting day for all our children! During the day, all children will take part in a 35-minute glow-in-the-dark dodgeball session. We have done this in previous years, and the children loved it! For this event, we ask that children come to school dressed in their brightest clothes. The organisers will also provide UV face paint for their session. If you do not want your child to wear the face paint, please let us know!

### Robinwood 2027 – For Current Year 5

We are excited to inform you that we have successfully booked our Year 6 residential trip to the Alston Site for Monday, 17th May to Wednesday, 19th May 2027. The total cost for this trip will be £355, and we are pleased to announce that the school fund will cover the full cost of the coach. It is important to note that there are 52 spaces for this trip, but there are 56 children in the year group, so this will be on a first-come basis. However, in all my years here, I have never seen the full year group attend, as it is a trip away from home and outdoors, which does not suit everyone.

To secure your child's place, please complete the attached form by 3.00 p.m. on Monday, 16th February. An initial non-refundable deposit of £25 is required, which must be paid by Friday, 24th April 2026. The payment structure operates on a reducing balance, meaning that after the initial deposit, you will need to make subsequent payments to cover the remaining balance. Please note that if the full payment is not received by the April 2027 deadline, your child will be unable to attend the trip. If you successfully complete this form, your confirmation of booking will be a payment item added to your ParentPay in the coming days.

We understand that not all children may wish to attend the residential trip. For those who choose not to participate, alternative activities will be arranged in the local area during this time, ensuring that every child has an engaging experience.

#### Mobile Phones and Smart Watches

Following the children's return after Christmas, more children are likely to bring their mobile phones into school. While we have no objection to this, we insist that children follow the school policy if they choose to bring their phones. All phones must be turned off upon entering the grounds and handed to their teacher. They can collect them at the end of the day and must not turn them on until they are outside the school grounds. Cellular smart watches are not permitted due to safeguarding concerns.

#### School Uniform

As this is the start of the new term, you may need to order more uniform. This can be done online at <u>Tots to Teams</u>. We have noticed some children starting to wear trainers on non-PE days and not the correct uniform items. Children not wearing the correct PE kit may be given spares to change into.
